Essentials for Volunteer Managers

Overview:

The Essentials for Volunteer Managers workshop covers theory and practice on the volunteer management cycle, including:

- the fundamentals of volunteer management, including policies, procedures and legislation
- planning for the involvement of volunteers
- recruitment and ongoing management of volunteers
- troubleshooting common issues
- appropriately recognising volunteers

This full day, interactive workshop will introduce the legal requirements underpinning volunteer involvement, explore research and theory on volunteer motivations, and provide practical tools to support you to implement a robust volunteering program in your organisation.

All attendees are provided with a workbook.
Morning tea and lunch is provided.

Overview:

The National Standards for Volunteer Involvement are a national best practice guide for volunteer involvement. This four-hour workshop will assist your organisation to prepare for the implementation of the National Standards. You will begin to unpack the changes that will be needed for your organisation to meet the requirements of the National Standards and begin the process of reviewing your organisation's performance using the Gap Analysis Tool.

All attendees will be provided with a hard copy of the National Standards Implementation Guide and Workbook.

Outcomes:

By the end of this session, you will:

- build a comprehensive knowledge of the National Standards for Volunteer Involvement;
- identify room for improvement in your own organisational setting;
- understand how to address gaps in your organisation; and,
- be equipped with the tools to assess and improve volunteer involvement.

The workshop will explore the positive outcomes of inclusive volunteering by reviewing case studies and utilising practical tips to increase inclusion. This workshop will provide you with the skills to remove the barriers to volunteering and provide you with the tools to help young people find meaningful volunteering opportunities. You will be challenged to consider the benefits that can be unlocked through volunteering, including a stronger sense of social inclusion in your workplace. Identifying barriers to inclusion and understanding simple solutions for removing these barriers will be explored from both the individual and organisational viewpoints.

- understand why we strive to be inclusive;
- be able to identify barriers to inclusion;
- have knowledge to reduce the impact of barriers; and,
- understand what it means to be part of an inclusive team.
